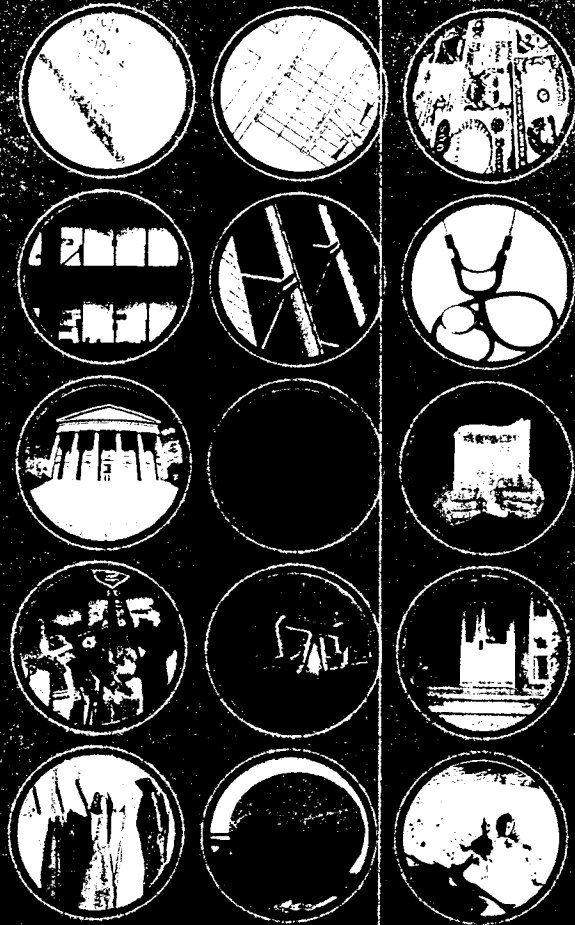

Amy Robertson is passionate about civil rights, as Kmart will attest. Robertson served as co-lead

counsel in a nationwide class-action lawsuit originally filed in 1999 to resolve disability issues at Kmart stores.

The suit was settled in March, with the superstore agreeing to bring all of its locations up to speed to ensure persons with disabilities access to merchandise, counters, parking and other facilities. Kmart will also pay \$13 million in damages.

Robertson and her partner/husband, Tim Fox, found-

ed the Denver-based firm in 1996 with this kind of result in mind, targeting civil rights statute violations.

Several high-profile companies have come under scrutiny through their efforts, including the Pepsi Center, Taco Bell, the U.S. Olympic Committee and Kohl's Department Stores.

Robertson received her law degree from Yale Law School in 1988.

As chair of Morrison & Foerster's Denver Corporate Group, Warren Troupe has had a busy year.

The M&A attorney has led the Colorado office of the San Fran-

cisco-based international firm through billions of dollars of debt and equity placements, representing a wide array of public and privately held companies.

In the past year in particular, Troupe has had a hand in some of the largest deals in the region.

In January, Troupe represented bad-debt buyer Collect America in its \$350 million sale to Denver-based KRG Capital Partners.

In June 2005, he represented HMS Healthcare in a \$385 million merger into Aetna.

He also represented Optika Inc. in its \$59 million sale to Stellent Inc. and led an effort to secure \$20 million Series C financing for InPhase Technologies.

He's also been involved in other high-profile mergers, counseling Atrix Laboratories in an \$855 million acquisition of all of its capital stock by QLT, and representing United Dominion Realty Trust in \$897 million of acquisitions in four transactions.
